

Stations of the Cross

Deacon Larry will lead the Stations of the Cross at 11:30 am (*prior to the noon daily Mass*). Fr. Daniel will lead the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm (*in place of the usual Friday night Holy Hour*).

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the church each Friday of Lent from after the 12 noon Mass until Benediction at 5:00 pm

Parish Lenten Mission

Dominican Friar, Father Joseph-Mary Hertzog will lead a three-day Parish Lenten Mission here at OLV during the first week of Lent - from Monday, March 10th to Wednesday, March 12th.

The Mission will begin at 6:30 pm with the praying of the Rosary, followed by music until 7:00 pm when the mission talk will begin. On Monday and Tuesday the Mission will conclude at 8:00 pm. Father will speak about "Christian Hope". This will be an opportunity for grace and spiritual renewal for individuals, families and our parish during this Jubilee Year and in preparation for Easter.

On Wednesday night there will Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the opportunity to be blessed with St. Joseph oil. Wednesday night will conclude at 8:30 with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Fr. Daniel and I will be available for Confessions each night of the mission.

Monday Night Holy Hours

Each Monday night of Lent, beginning March 17th, the Monday night Rosary will be prayed at 7:00 pm with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, meditative music, and the opportunity for confession after the Rosary until Benediction at 8 pm.







What Newsday Found

Advocates of bill that would allow terminally ill people with 6 months or less to live the option to take life-ending medication said its getting more wide-spread support among statewide groups.



The liturgical season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. During this liturgical season, we devote ourselves in a special way to the relationship we

want to have with God, and the healthy and holy life we want to share with one another. During Lent, the Church calls us to pray, to fast, and to give freely to those in need (almsgiving). During this time we choose to prioritize, what we know is of ultimate value: our faith in Jesus Christ.

As parents, we are our children's first teachers. Throughout Lent, we can help our children better understand the simple practice of prayer. We can point out that just as our bodies get hungry for food; our souls get hungry for Jesus. We can model almsgiving for our children by asking them to join us in the special giving we do at this time of year. These 40 days give us an opportunity to help our children celebrate the true meaning of Easter.
