Dear Parishioners,

Welcome to the holiest week of the year, appropriately called HOLY WEEK. What makes it holy are the numerous liturgical opportunities that are available to us this week to remember and celebrate the most significant events of history - the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

Palm Sunday / Passion Sunday

This weekend begins Holy Week with the celebration of Palm/Passion Sunday. We will recall Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem and we will then hear St. Luke's version of the Lord's Passion and Death.

Reconciliation Monday - April 14

Fr. Daniel and I will be in the confessionals from 2 pm to 4 pm, and again from 6 pm to 9 pm for individual confessions.

Priests will be available during those same hours in churches throughout the metropolitan area.

Chrism Mass - Tuesday, April 15

Bishop Barres will celebrate the Chrism Mass at St. Agnes Cathedral at 4 pm on Tuesday of Holy Week. It is at this Mass that the holy oils are blessed and consecrated and then distributed for use throughout the diocese. All are welcome to this Mass at St. Agnes Cathedral in Rockville Centre.

Holy Thursday - April 17

There are no morning Masses on Holy Thursday. We will pray Morning Prayer together at 8:30 am.



The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7:30 pm. During this Mass the holy oils will be presented, and

twelve parishioners will participate in the Washing of Feet ritual in imitation of the act of humble service that Jesus performed at the Last Supper.

Good Friday - April 18

Morning Prayer will be prayed at 8:30 am. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed in church at 12 noon and 7:30 pm



There will be Stations of the Cross for children in Memorial Park at 1:30 pm on Good Friday.

The Liturgy of the Lord's Passion will take place at 3

pm. This will include the reading of the Passion, the Veneration of the Cross, and distribution of Holy Communion. This liturgy will also be broadcast to the chapel.

Holy Saturday - April 19

Morning Prayer will be prayed on Holy Saturday morning at 8:30 am.

Confessions will be heard from 11:30 to 12:30, and from 2 to 3:30 pm

In the evening, the lengthy, yet beautiful Easter Vigil, will begin at 7:30 pm. It starts with the Paschal Candle being lit and the congregation holding candles in a darkened church. We will then listen to 7 readings from Scripture. Then two adults, Karina Rodriguez and Louis Leung will receive the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. If you have never experienced this liturgy before, consider joining us this year.



The following changes will be made regarding Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning the Friday after Easter.


On every Friday there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament immediately after the 12 noon Mass. This period of Adoration will end with Benediction at 3 pm.



Palm Sunday

As we begin the Triduum, a Latin word that means "three days", Holy Thursday, Good Friday and

Holy Saturday (The Easter Vigil) our rituals, celebrations and prayer times take on a special significance. We also rely on strong symbolism and deeply meaningful gestures to capture the fullness of what we remember and celebrate at this time of year.

As parents, we can offer an especially meaningful learning experience to our children during this time, by helping them take special notice of the many symbols and gestures we use. There is the silence and darkness and stripping of the altar after Mass on Holy Thursday; there is the Good Friday service, when children will notice that a good part of the Mass is "missing", as well as a Stations of the Cross; there is the rejoicing at the Easter Vigil as we progress from darkness to light.

Together, let us draw our children's attention to these symbols and express the great mystery of the "three days".
