Thursday, January 1—Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God

The New Year of 2026 begins with the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God - appropriately enough we conclude the Octave of Christmas by honoring Mary as Mother.



This feast day is a holyday of obligation with the following Mass schedule:

Thurs., Jan. 1 8:30 am, 10:30 am, 12 noon & 7:00 pm.

Friday, Jan. 2 - First Friday of January

Start the New Year by starting the First Friday devotion with Mass at 8:30 am or 12 noon. Confessions will be heard during the 7:00 pm First Friday Holy Hour.

Sat., Jan. 3—Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus

Join me in my special devotion to the Holy Name by often praying, “*Praised be the name of Jesus Christ now and forever!*”

Sunday, Jan. 4 - Feast of the Epiphany



What is a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD)?

- A direct transfer of funds from your IRA to a qualified charity (like OLV!).
Available to those aged 70½ or older.

Key Benefits:

- Counts toward RMD: Satisfies your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year.
- Reduces Taxable Income: Lowers your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI).
- No Itemizing Needed: You don't need to itemize deductions to benefit.
- Tax-Free: The gift is tax-free for you.

Quick Facts for 2025:

- Limit: Up to \$108,000 per person.
- Deadline: December 31st.
- Must go directly from your IRA custodian to the charity.

How to Give via QCD:

Contact your IRA Custodian: Ask them to send the funds directly to your parish or Diocese and mention it's for a QCD.
